Login: Objectives

- Authenticate user
- Load user configuration information
- Initialize desktop environment
 - Create mount points
 - Set environment variables
 - Process NSM directives
 - ► Start the window manger
- Process logout events
- Cleanup and reinitialize system environment





Login: What's New

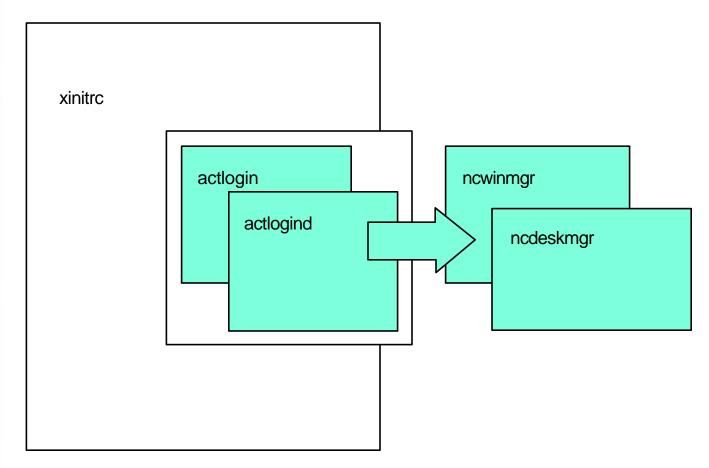
■ Network Station Login is now two programs

- Rational
 - Mutually exclusive task sets
 - Performance
 - Logout considerations
 - Design flexibility
- actlogin tasks
 - Display login GUI
 - Obtain user credentials
 - Authenticate user
 - exec() actlogind
- actlogind tasks
 - Initialize user environment
 - Start window manager / desktop
 - Logout clean up

Login: What's New

■ True Kiosk Mode

- ▶ No authentication
- User profiles are not loaded
- ► No user registry created
- ► Create mount points in IFS





Login: What's Changed

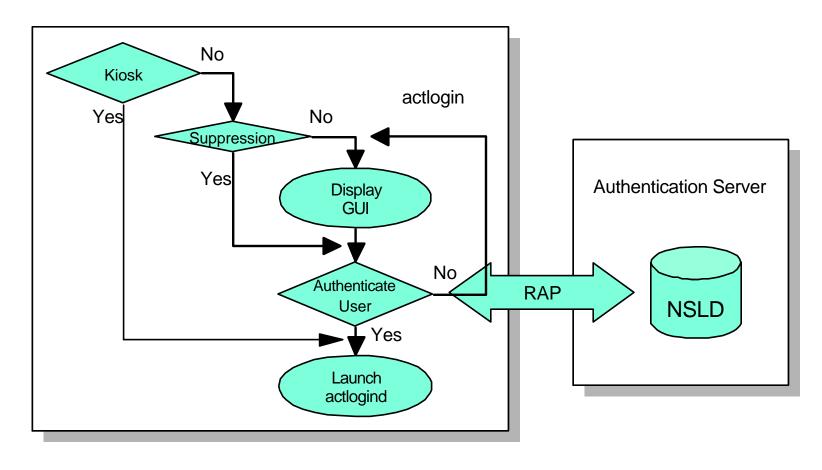
- V1R3 "kiosk" mode now V2R1 "suppression" mode
 - ▶ \$TermBase/ncs/kiosk.nsl
 - Copied to /tmp for actlogin visibility
- User configuration from XML
- V1R3 Taskbar replaced with V2R1 Launchbar





Actlogin Flow

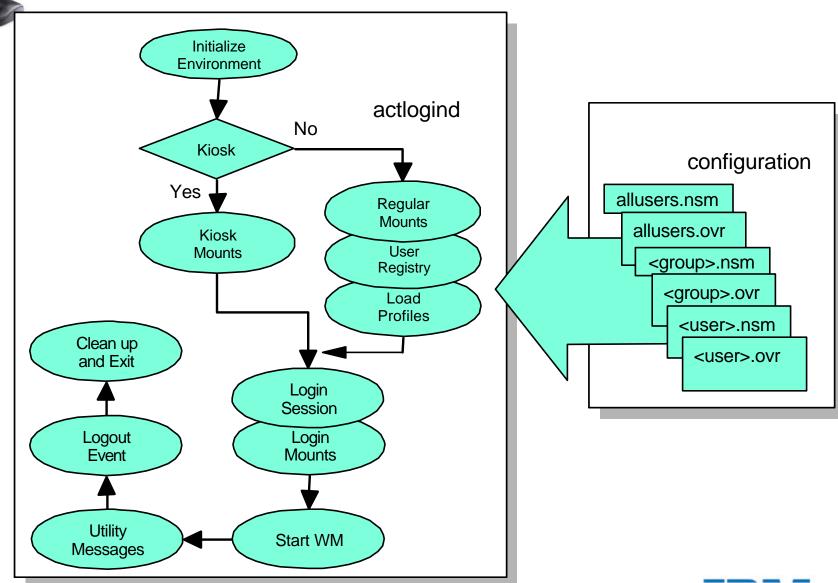
GUI and Authentication

NSLD

- V2R1 NSLD backward compatible with V1R3
 - ► Services requests from V2R1 and V1R3 clients
- User Configuration Server based on NS IP Address
 - ► Function PTFed in V1R3
 - Configuration Server platform restrictions





Advanced Information

- Use of editres to change login GUI
 - /usr/X11R6/bin/editres
 - /etc/actlogin.conf
 - ► Make backup copy!
- Adding customer-specific error messages
 - ►/nls/xx_XX/Login MRI file
 - Must change each language that will be used
- Kiosk mode implementation
 - ► SET NSM_KIOSK_MODE ON
 - /desktop/preferences:desktop_command
 - ► No user profiles loaded => Some NSM options will not take effect
 - Launching several kiosk applications
